Where H is the head causing flow? D is the diameter of the orifice,  $\mu$  is the co-efficient of viscosity, g is the mass density and g is the acceleration due to gravity.

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(d) An oil of specific gravity 0.9 and viscosity 0.003  $\frac{N}{m^2}$  s is required to transport through a pipe of 1 m diameter at the rate of 0.3 m<sup>3</sup>/sec. Tests were conducted on a 10 mm diameter pipe using water at  $20^{\circ}$ C.

The density and viscosity of water at 20° C are  $1000 \text{ kg/m}^3$  and  $0.001 \frac{N}{m^2}$  s, respectively. Determine the average velocity and rate of flow in the model.

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(ii) Much number
